# תָּמִים Tamiym tä·mēm'

- complete, whole, entire, sound
- complete, whole, entire
- whole, sound, healthful
- complete, entire (of time)
- sound, wholesome, unimpaired, innocent, having integrity
- what is complete or entirely in accord with truth and fact (neuter adj/subst)
  
- The KJV translates in the following manner: without blemish (44x), perfect (18x), upright (8x), without spot (6x), uprightly (4x), whole (4x), sincerely (2x), complete (1x), full (1x), miscellaneous (3x).

Psalm 119:80

Let my heart be blameless regarding Your statutes, That I may not be ashamed.

The righteousness of the blameless will direct his way aright, But the wicked will fall by his own wickedness.

Deuteronomy 18:13

"You shall be blameless before the LORD your God.

(performing God's commands completely)

## Genesis 6:14-15

14 "Make for yourself an ark of gopher wood; you shall make the ark with rooms, and shall cover it inside and out with pitch. 15 "This is how you shall make it: the length of the ark three hundred cubits, its breadth fifty cubits, and its height thirty cubits.

A cubit is approximately 18 inches, so the dimensions of the ark would have been 450 feet long, 75 feet wide, and 45 feet high. Some authorities maintain that the cubit is as much as 24 inches.
